

## HMCS Athabaskan



29 Apr 1944

HMCS Athabaskan was sunk in the English Channel by two torpedoes from the German torpedo boats. The magazine and a boiler blew up in an explosion that was seen 20 miles away.

83 men were picked up from the water and were taken as POWs by the Germans boats.

Another 44 of the crew were picked up by HMCS Haida.  
128 of the crew went down with the ship

Remembrance Day is a yearly Memorial Day that is observed in many Commonwealth countries, including Canada, to remember those who died in military service, and honour those who served in wartime. It is observed across Canada each year on 11 November — the anniversary of the Armistice agreement of 1918 that ended the First World War. On Remembrance Day, public ceremonies and church services often include the playing of “Last Post,” a reading of the fourth stanza of the poem “For the Fallen,” and two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. Wreaths are laid at local war memorials. Millions of Canadians wear red poppy pins in the weeks leading up to and on 11 November in remembrance. In 2020, Remembrance Day services and events were affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Many events were either held online, cancelled, or limited to a small number of participants due to fear of contagion.



## Turkey and Vegetable Barley Soup

| 1 tablespoon canola oil             | 5 medium carrots, chopped         |
| 1 medium onion, chopped             | 2/3 cup quick-cooking barley      |
| 6 cups reduced-sodium chicken broth | 2 cups cubed cooked turkey breast |
| 2 cups fresh baby spinach           | 1/2 teaspoon pepper               |

In a large saucepan, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add carrots and onion; cook and stir until carrots are crisp-tender, 4-5 minutes. Stir in barley and broth; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, until carrots and barley are tender, 15 minutes. Stir in turkey, spinach and pepper, heat through.

| 1 tablespoon olive oil                                          | 1 medium onion, chopped         |
| 1 celery stalk, chopped                                         | 1 medium carrot, chopped        |
| 4 cups Swiss chard, stems removed, chopped                      | 1 garlic clove, minced          |
| 1 can (14-1/2 oz) diced tomatoes, undrained                     | 1 bay leaf                      |
| 1 teaspoon rubbed sage                                          | 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning    |
| 1/2 teaspoon pepper                                             | 1 carton (32 oz.) chicken broth |
| 1 can (15 oz.) cannellini beans, rinsed and drained             | 1 tablespoon lemon juice        |



In a 6-qt. stockpot, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add sausage, onion, celery and carrot; cook 6-8 minutes or until sausage is no longer pink and vegetables are tender, breaking up sausage into crumbles. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer.

Stir in Swiss chard, tomatoes, bay leaf and seasonings. Add broth; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, 10-12 minutes or until Swiss chard is tender. Stir in beans and lemon juice, heat through.

# Cheddar Seafood Chowder

- 6 bacon strips, chopped
- 1/2 cup chopped sweet orange pepper
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) chicken broth
- 2 medium red potatoes, cubed
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 pound uncooked medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 1/2 pound bay scallops
- 2 celery ribs, finely chopped
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups 2% milk
- 1 teaspoon seafood seasoning
- 1-1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese

In a large saucepan, cook bacon over medium until crisp. Remove to paper towels with a slotted spoon; drain, reserving 2 tablespoons drippings.

In the drippings, sauté the celery, orange pepper onion until crisp-tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Stir in flour until blended; gradually add broth and milk. Bring to a boil; and stir for 1 minute or until thickened.

Add the potatoes, seafood seasoning and salt; to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for minutes or until potatoes are tender.

Add shrimp and scallops; cook and stir for 3-4 minutes or until shrimp turn pink and scallops are opaque. Stir in cheese until melted. Garnish each serving with bacon.

# Bean Counter Chowder

- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) chicken broth
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil,
- 1/2 teaspoon celery flakes
- 3 cans (15-1/2 ounces each) great northern beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 cup uncooked elbow macaroni
- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 1 medium tomato, chopped
- 1-3/4 cups water
- 1/2 teaspoon oregano,
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 tablespoon minced parsley



In a large saucepan, sauté onion in oil until tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Add the tomato; simmer for 5 minutes. Add the broth, water and seasonings. Bring to a boil; cook for 5 minutes. Add beans and macaroni; return to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, until macaroni is tender, about 15 minutes. Sprinkle with parsley.
