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

## HMCS Ottawa (H60)



September 14, 1942

Just having rescued 13 crew and 5 gunners from the Tanker “Empire Oil” the HMCS Ottawa was attacked by the German Submarine U-91. Two torpedoes were aimed at the ship but only one struck amidships and the destroyer blew up and sank immediately.

With the loss of 106 crew and the 18 shipwrecked men rescued earlier

***"The Ottawa got it on the 13th,  
there were only 69 survivors out of a crew of 175, plus 50 that they had  
picked out of the water. She was hit in the mess deck and in the boiler room.  
She broke in two. The halves stood on end and went straight down"***

# Private Bookings of the Club

## Members ONLY

O.C.N.V.A. members wanting to reserve the club, must fill out a “Special Occasion Request for use of Facilities” form, which will include member’s name & club #, describing the event, date, time, estimated number of guests and areas of club requesting. The forms are available from the office or a bartender on duty.

You must pay a set donation for the use of the club. (i.e. - operational cost of the club) payable at time of booking.

**If it is approved, as an O.C.N.V.A. Member, you MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE for the duration (start time to finish) and assume responsibility for all guests.**

- No outside Caterers allowed



- Food ordered from galley - 50% \$ deposit is required at the time of approval,
  - All OCNVA club rules and regulations must be adhered to (Dress code, code of conduct, no political, social causes or advertisement signage allowed on the grounds)

( draws, lotteries, 50/50, etc..... NOT permitted for private functions)

- Entertainment: You are financially responsible for any entertainment you wish to hire.

- Galley, Club rooms and utilized areas **MUST** be cleaned properly after your event plus ALL tables & chairs to be returned to their original locations. Failure to do so will result in a \$100.00 custodial charge.

- Decorations are permitted – **ABSOLUTELY NO CONFETTI OR POPCORN OF ANY KIND.**

Sunday booking requires a mandatory bartender on duty. In addition to the Club use fee, you will be responsible for the bartender’s wage for your event. You will be invoiced for the charge and may NOT pay cash directly to the bartender on duty. If a 2<sup>nd</sup> bartender is requested, a charge will also apply. Sunday booking, someone of authority must be present, this is a security and safety measure.

***Any person under suspension from club privileges may not enter the premises or be signed in as a guest for special occasions***



## Easy Crescent Veggie Pizza



cauliflower,

8 ounces refrigerated crescent rolls 1 can- use the full sheet crescent dough if you can find it!  
4 ounces cream cheese softened (reduced-fat or full fat)  
½ cup sour cream light or full fat  
2 tablespoon ranch dip mix  
1 tablespoon fresh chives chopped  
salt and pepper to taste  
2 cups chopped assorted veggies - broccoli, bell peppers, carrots, green onion, cucumber, chopped tomatoes (seeds removed),

Preheat oven to 350°F.

Prepare the spread by combining sour cream, cream cheese, ranch dip mix, and chives in a small bowl and stirring until well combined. Transfer to the refrigerator and let chill for at least 15 minutes.



Remove crescent rolls from can and roll out on a parchment lined baking sheet. Try to keep the entire piece intact. You want one large sheet so pinch together any seams that are not staying together

Bake for 6 to 7 minutes. Remove and let cool.

Spread chilled cream cheese mixture onto cooled crescent roll sheet.

Top with fresh veggies and additional chives if desired.

Use a pizza cutter or large knife to cut down to appetizer size pieces and serve.



Try your favorite combination of chopped fresh veggies to make this recipe your own. Be sure to cut the vegetables so they are bite-size, so they top the pizza nicely and are easier to eat. Finish with a sprinkle of shredded Parmesan cheese for extra flavor.

**Storage Information:** Store any leftover veggie pizza in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to 2 days. Keep in mind that the crescent rolls will start to get soggy as they absorb the cream cheese mixture.

# Sweet Pepper Jelly



- 3/4 cup finely chopped red bell pepper
- 3/4 cup finely chopped green bell pepper
- 1 1/2 cup white vinegar
- 6 1/2 cups white sugar
- 2 packets liquid pectin, 6 tablespoons
- 3 Pint Sized canning jars - sterilized, or 6-7 Half Pint Sized canning jars

Combine the first 4 ingredients in a large stainless steel saucepan (make sure to use one with high sides because it will rise and you don't want it to boil over).

Bring mixture to a boil, and boil for 6 minutes, stirring constantly.

Add the pectin and continue boiling and stirring for an additional 3 minutes.

Remove from heat and skim off (and discard) any foam on top with a spoon. Ladle the jelly into the prepared jars. Wipe off the rims and apply the lids.

Place the jars in a large pot of water and bring to a boil for 10 minutes. Carefully remove from water and let cool. Jars can be stored at room temperature. Once opened, store in refrigerator.



➤ Spice up your sweet Pepper jelly by adding

1/4 - 1/2 cup jalapeno pepper- seeded and finely chopped

- You can make the jalapeno jelly as spicy or mild as you want. For a mildly spicy version, I keep the seeds in about half of the jalapeno peppers. For a spicier jelly, don't remove the seeds.
- To help prevent the peppers from floating to the top of the jar once you ladle them into the jar, remove from the heat and gently stir every minute for 5 minutes. Then ladle into the jars.

Place a brick of cream cheese on a plate or small serving platter.

Pour Sweet Pepper Jelly on top. Spread on crackers.

Eat said crackers.

Glaze on vegetables.

Glaze on meats such as ham and pork chops.

Glaze on chicken wings.

Mix pepper jelly with cream cheese for a dip.
