This meeting is dedicated to **HMCS** Weyburn



On 22 February 1943,

HMCS Weyburn struck a mine, which ripped open the portside splitting the funnel from bottom to top and buckling the decks. After the initial explosion, all firing pins from the depth charges were safely removed except for two, which had jammed.

Into the rescue operation, something gave way inside Weyburn and the ship sank. As the ship sank the two depth charges whose pins had not been removed exploded, killing those in the water and killing and severely injuring members of the rescue ship.

The loss of 12 men We must never forget their sacrifice.



COZY AUTUMN WILD RICE SOUP

6 cups vegetable stock (or chicken stock)

8 ounces mushrooms, sliced

2 medium carrots, diced

1 large, sweet potato, peeled and diced

1 bay leaf

1 ½ cups of half and half

fine sea salt

and freshly cracked black pepper

1 cup uncooked wild rice*

4 cloves garlic, minced.

2 ribs celery, diced.

1 small white onion, peeled and diced

1 1/2 tablespoon Cajun seasoning

2 large handfuls of kale, roughly chopped with thick stems removed.

Sauté the veggies. Heat (an extra) 1 tablespoon butter or olive oil in a <u>large</u> stockpot over medium-high heat. Add onion and sauté for 5 minutes, stirring

occasionally, until soft and translucent. Stir in the garlic and cook for an additional 1-2 minutes, stirring occasionally, until fragrant.

Add base ingredients. Add in the vegetable stock, wild rice, mushrooms, carrots, celery, sweet potato, bay leaf and Cajun seasoning. Stir to combine.

Simmer. Continue cooking until the soup reaches a simmer. Then reduce heat to medium-low, cover and simmer for 30 to 40 minutes until the rice is tender, stirring occasionally.

Add final ingredients. Add the half & half and kale to the soup, and stir gently until combined. Taste and season with salt and pepper as needed.

Serve. Serve warm and enjoy!







Lemon Chicken Orzo Soup

2 Tablespoons butter

3 cloves garlic, minced

2 medium carrots diced

2 chicken breast

Boneless, skinless

4 tablespoons lemon juice

2 tablespoon fresh dill chopped

1 medium onion chopped finely.

2 sticks celery, diced.

5 cups chicken stock.

½ teaspoon Italian Seasoning

½ cup dry orzo, uncooked

2 tablespoons fresh parsley, chopped.

salt and pepper to taste.

Melt butter in a medium pot over medium heat. Add onions and garlic and sauté until onions are soft and translucent, about 3-4 minutes. Add in celery and carrots and continue to sauté for another 3 minutes, stirring often.

Add stock, chicken, and Italian seasoning. Bring to a boil on high heat, then cover, reduce heat to low, and simmer for 20 minutes.

Remove chicken from pot and add orzo. Cook uncovered on medium high until the orzo is cooked through (about 10 more minutes), stirring occasionally. Meanwhile shred the chicken with a fork and then place back into the pot, while the orzo is still cooking.



Once orzo is cooked, stir in lemon juice, parsley, and dill. Season with salt and pepper, to taste.

Serve immediately with some extra lemon wedges and fresh herbs.


How to make with pre-cooked chicken: You can make this soup with leftover chicken or rotisserie chicken. Add it in when you are adding in the orzo.



How to serve: Serve lemon chicken orzo soup with some Greek salad and a loaf of crusty bread. Small batch ciabatta rolls, easy no knead french baguettes, small batch no-knead bread, or small batch sourdough.

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
