



Private Bookings of the Club Members ONLY

O.C.N.V.A. members must fill out a "Special Occasion Request for use of Facilities" form describing the event. The forms are available from the office or a bartender on duty.

You must pay a set donation for the use of the club, payable at the time of booking.

If it is approved, as an O.C.N.V.A. Member, you <u>MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE</u> for the duration (start time to finish) and assume responsibility for all guests.

Galley, Club rooms, and utilized areas MUST be cleaned properly after your event plus <u>ALL</u> tables & chairs are to be returned to their original locations. Failure to do so will result in a custodial charge.

Sunday booking requires a mandatory bartender on duty. In addition to the Club use fee, you will be responsible for the bartender's wage for your event. You will be invoiced for the charge and may NOT pay cash directly to the bartender on duty.



Parade and Commemoration Ceremony

Canada and its Naval community commemorate those lost at sea in the longest campaign of the Second World War

Join us in our memorial service

The Battle of the Atlantic was Canada's longest military engagement of the Second World War, lasting from September 1939 to May 1945. This battle was bravely fought by the men and women of the Canadian Merchant Navy, the Royal Canadian Navy, and the Royal Canadian Air Force.



We must never forget their sacrifice!







Several members have approached me recently and questioned how the balance of the membership categories works in the Navy Club.

As an RCNA affiliate club, we are governed by the rule that the number of Social members must never exceed 50% of the total club membership. I have to add in here that the 50% is against the total current club membership, not the club maximum membership although the two numbers are now getting very much closer. The number of Social members then varies as any members resign or leave the club.

As membership chair, I report to the Executive on a monthly basis with the total club membership and also the numbers for each of the individual categories and with the club being so successful, we are now rapidly approaching the club's maximum membership. We may have to begin putting a hold on accepting any new member applications and introduce a waiting list system, as has been done in the past. The total membership at the end of March 2024 is 878 members with about 47% of those being Social members. The breakdown of the categories is below.

On Saturday, April 20th starting at 1:15 p.m. we will be holding a Trillium Grant Recognition with a representative from the Ontario Trillium Foundation being in attendance along with some local dignitaries such as Ernie Hardeman MPP and Mayor Jerry Acchione. Please be sure to come out and attend and celebrate the Trillium Grant we received from our Provincial Government for our new Universal Washroom that was recently completed.

So far, we have been able to stay away from the Federal Government needing to add a 4.7% increase on alcohol taxes starting April 1st. This is some very good news for us. With our Club now having a larger member base comes with additional costs. Our liability insurance has increased significantly because of our uptick in sales, 2-1/2 times what we paid over a year ago. We are paying 5.3% extra on every dollar we bring in.

There continues to be a lot of action at the Club with various functions that have been planned for your enjoyment. The Sports Committee will again be hosting the annual Perch Fish Fry on April 27th and the list continues. Sandra does a great job keeping us all posted as to what is happening and coming up in the Club, be sure to check your email and the posters inside the Club. We need to have successful functions to help us continue to operate. Please be sure to come out to support the various meals and events at the Club.



The Pond

The land of the O.C.N.V.A. is private property and is solely and primarily for the use of members who are in good standing.

Our pond is spring-fed and stocked by Gehrings Fish Farms, Otterville

By-Laws for the Pond Page 23 of your O.C.N.V.A By-Law book.

No unauthorized person is allowed to use the pond.

Members can fish anytime unless otherwise stated – signs will be posted in the gangway and/or in front of the pond.

When the club rooms are closed, non-members must accompany a club member when fishing. Members are permitted to bring 2 non-members.


Baiting of the pond is strictly prohibited.

The Navy Club encourages you to take your catch home. Catch and release is causing too many dead fish in the pond. No more than 2 fish per person, per 24 hours. It is illegal to take or attempt to take more than the limit. It's your club.....your pond....do not abuse it or let anyone else.

Good fishing

Interesting information about your club!

- ✓ All service clubs request you remove your hat to honour the fallen soldiers and our veterans. Except in the case of religious beliefs and medical reasons, please remove your hat before entering the club rooms.
- ✓ The rule is, <u>do not ring the ship's bell</u> unless you wish to buy a round of drinks for everyone in the club. Two ship bells in the club, one at the entrance to the club room and one by the stage on the wall.
- ✓ The pond out front of the Navy Club is spring feed and is stocked yearly for members' use. It is stocked at the beginning of May and open for fishing after Mother's day. The pond has been dredged twice, with the member's generous donations to help offset the cost. We hold a Kid's Fishing Derby every Mother's Day in May, the Veterans from Parkwood Hospital in London come down for the day and fish, and we allow the Woodstock Fire Department the use of our pond for Ice Water Rescue Training in the winter. Look for signs in the gangway stating if the pond is open or closed for fishing. Further details are on page 21.
- ✓ We have numerous leagues that start in October and end in April. Ladies Shuffleboard, Men's Shuffleboard, Mixed Darts, Snooker and starting in the fall Cornhole. ONLY MEMBERS can join our leagues. Watch for notices and sign-up sheets come the Fall.







Vegetable Cream Cheese Rollups

1/2 cup Sour cream

1/4 tsp Onion powder

1/4 teaspoon Salt

½ cup Broccoli

½ cup Bell pepper

4 ounces Cream cheese softened

1/4 tsp Garlic powder

1/4 teaspoon Dill dried 1/8 teaspoon Pepper

1/4 cup Sharp cheddar cheese shredded

½ cup Carrots shredded, about 1 medium-sized carrot or 6 baby carrots

3 8 - Inch Tortillas

Cut the cream cheese into cubes and allow it to soften on the counter. Add the sour cream and mix the cream cheese and sour cream together until the cream cheese is smooth.

Add garlic powder, onion powder, dill, salt, and pepper to the cheese mixture and mix well. Mix in shredded cheddar cheese.

Dice the broccoli and bell pepper and shred the carrots into small pieces.

Lay the tortillas out on a cutting board. Spread each tortilla with ½ of the cream cheese mixture. Sprinkle the vegetables evenly between the tortillas on top of the cheese spread. Roll the tortillas tightly. Use a few toothpicks to keep them rolled tight. Placing the rollups in the freezer for at least 10-15 minutes allows the spread to firm up and makes it easier to slice

With a sharp knife, cut the tortilla into rolls that are about an inch thick. Each tortilla makes about six full slices. Serve and enjoy!


