

February 6, 1943

On the afternoon of February 6, 1943, while escorting a convoy, the HMCS Louisburg was attacked by 2 separate formations of German planes. Hit by bombs and torpedoes, HMCS Louisburg sank!

The HMCS Louisburg was the only Canadian naval vessel lost through enemy aircraft action during the war.

38 crew were lost.

We must never forget their sacrifice

*Many of the fatalities were caused when the ship's depth charges detonated as she sank.

*The Commander of the ship was last seen entering the mess decks to check for survivors, who had not yet followed his order to abandon ship.

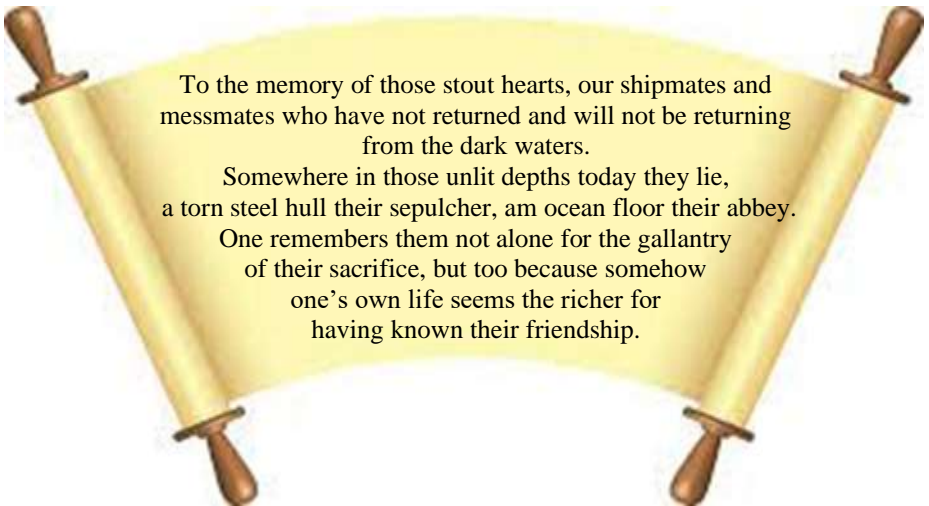

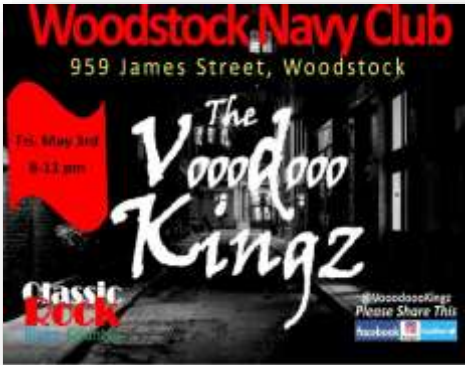

The Pond

The land of the O.C.N.V.A. is private property and is solely and primarily for the use of members who are in good standing.

Our pond is spring-fed and stocked by Gehrings Fish Farms, Otterville
By-Laws for the Pond Page 23 of your O.C.N.V.A By-Law book.

No unauthorized person is allowed to use the pond.

Members can fish anytime unless otherwise stated – signs will be posted in the gangway and/or in front of the pond.

When the club rooms are closed, non-members must accompany a club member when fishing. Members are permitted to bring 2 non-members.

Baiting of the pond is strictly prohibited.

The Navy Club encourages you to take your catch home. Catch and release is causing too many dead fish in the pond. No more than 2 fish per person, per 24 hours. It is illegal to take or attempt to take more than the limit.

It's your club.....your pond....do not abuse it or let anyone else.

7 Layer Dip Cups

1 (16-ounce) can refried beans
4 ounces cream cheese, softened,
1 ½ tablespoons taco seasoning
1 cup guacamole
1 cup sour cream
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
2 Roma tomatoes, diced and drained of juices.
Optional (for topping): salsa, sliced olives,
chopped cilantro, sliced green onions, salt,
pepper.
For serving: Tortilla chips or Fritos



In a small bowl, stir beans, cream cheese, and taco seasoning until smooth. Create equal layers in 8 (9-ounce) plastic tumblers by spreading 2 Tablespoons of beans, 2 Tablespoons guacamole, and 2 Tablespoons sour cream in each cup. Sprinkle the cheese and diced tomatoes over the top of each. Finish with sliced olives, green onions, and cilantro, if desired. Season with salt and pepper, if using. Cover and store in the refrigerator until ready to serve. The dip is best eaten the day it is made. Serve with fresh tortilla chips or Fritos. Enjoy!

Alternatively, you can mix the cream cheese and taco seasoning in with the sour cream.
You could also add 1 Tablespoon ranch seasoning mix to the sour cream if you prefer.
You can substitute salsa for the tomatoes.

Make-ahead: If you are wanting to make it ahead of time, I would do the bean and sour cream layer and refrigerate. Then add the guacamole and toppings right before serving, so it stays fresh.
